

EUSOBI Annual Scientific Meeting 2017

The Carla Boetes Award

September 22-23, 2017 | Berlin, Germany

This EUSOBI initiative, in the name of our beloved Prof. Carla Boetes means to honour young radiologists or nuclear medicine specialists that have made a significant contribution to breast imaging research.

During the EUSOBI Annual Scientific Meeting 2017 in Berlin, Germany, the society will offer 1 radiologist or nuclear medicine specialist under 40 the possibility to orally present his/her recent breast related work in the plenary lecture hall of the EUSOBI Annual Scientific Meeting and receive the prestigious Carla Boetes Award.

An extended abstract (1000 words, excluding references) on recent results from a research project, which has not yet been published in journals is required.

Abstracts should be submitted before April 24, 2017, 23:59 (CET), through the digital abstract submission site <https://esociety.netkey.at/eusobi/abstractsubmission/>, and must be accompanied by your signed CV.

Award

EUSOBI is happy to cover the registration fee for the Carla Boetes Awardee and will present him/her with a grant of € 2.000,00.

Qualification criteria of the applicant

- To be a certified radiologist or nuclear physician (certification required) radiologist/nuclear medicine physician
- To be younger than 40 years at the date of the submission deadline (copy of passport/identity card required)
- To be a member of the EUSOBI in good standing
- To have published at least three breast imaging related papers in English in a peer-reviewed journal as first author
- To be the first author of the submitted extended abstract
- To have submitted your signed CV with detailed information about your career (including medical graduation, post-graduation certificated, PhD, etc.), involvement in clinical and/or screening breast imaging, and engagement in breast imaging research; please add a complete list of publications in peer reviewed journals

Qualification criteria of the abstract

- The abstract should neither be published/presented at another meeting, nor be an already published article (print and online), prior to September 2017
- The first author of the abstract needs to be the applicant

Abstract structure

Abstracts should be no longer than 1000 words, excluding title and references, and be structured as follows:

Title

Provide an attractive and concise title for your work

Background

Clearly describe the scientific and clinical problem you have focused your research on

Methods

Briefly describe the different steps that you have taken to tackle the scientific/clinical problem

Results

Report the obtained results in a straightforward manner

Clinical Relevance

Discuss why your results have had a significant effect on breast care, and how this changes practice

Future Work

Explain the remaining problems, and the future work you intend to undertake to tackle these issues

References (up to 25)

Co-authors

Rating

All abstracts will be peer reviewed by 3 independent reviewers. Abstracts will be scored on scientific merits, relevance to the EUSOBI audience, clinical impact, originality, and clarity of presentation. CV's will be evaluated on scientific and clinical strength.

The following scoring system will be used:

- 1 = Excellent
- 2 = Good
- 3 = Moderate
- 4 = Fair
- 5 = Poor
